

Tips: discussing screening results with Families

Prepare to Meet	Review Results
Provide follow-up information as soon as possible.	Set a positive friendly tone.
Make time for questions and conversation.	Assure that the conversation is confidential.
Make notes about the child / family strengths and any challenges the child is having (ASQ-3, ASQ:SE, and classroom observations).	Remind the family about the purpose of screening.
	Begin review of items marked YES.
Gather information you might need from the family (e.g., child's health information).	Celebrate skills the child is doing and what you enjoy about their child.
Select a time that works for the family. Include important family members who know and care for the child.	Read through the Results letters together. Emphasize the child's strengths.
Select a private, comfortable place.	Use this time to find out more about the child. Children may show different skills or behaviors at home and at school.
Consider culture or language differences. An interpreter may be needed or there may be family members who must be included.	Parent and teacher responses may be different and still be accurate.

Provide fun ideas for practicing skills using the ASQ Play and Learning Activities. Follow the parent's lead and decide Next Steps actions together
